NC Board of PT Examiners Report to the NCPTA Business Meeting

Forsyth Medical Center Winston-Salem, NC April 24, 2010 Ben F. Massey, Jr., PT, MA Executive Director

- 1. **Purpose of the Board:** Reminder that the purpose of the Board is to regulate the practice of physical therapy in order to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of North Carolina. The next NC Board of PT Examiners Meeting is scheduled on June 10, 2010.
- 2. **Appointments to the Board:** The Governor appointed Debbie Ragan, PT, and Pearl Rhone, PTA, to their second 3-year terms, commencing on January 1, 2010. The Board re-elected Leslie Kesler, PT, as Chair, and Stu MacRoberts, PT, as Secretary-Treasurer.

On April 21, 2010, the Call for Nominations Letter * was posted on the Board's web page seeking recommendations for one (1) physical therapist and one (1) medical doctor for appointments commencing on January 1, 2011. In addition, the Governor will be appointing a public member. Paul Garcia, MD, and Gloria Lewis, Public Member will be completing their first terms in office and are eligible for reappointment. Leslie Kesler, PT, will be completing her second term of office and is not eligible for reappointment. . * (*The Call for Nominations Letter will <u>not</u> be mailed this year as it is posted on the Board's web site. Please spread the word among licensees.*)

- 3. Fees: The last time the Board enacted a Rules change to allow a fee increase was November 1, 2006; however, it chose not to implement the fee increase until March 1, 2007. Although the Board has incurred significant costs with the implementation of continuing competence in the last few years, it has not increased the fees. It has been able to maintain the current fees by increasing efficiencies, primarily through the use of technology. However, in an effort to maintain the fees at the current level for the next few years (and also in an effort to be environmentally conscious), at its recent meeting the Board voted to implement additional cost saving measures in 2011 (eg, discontinue printing the Directory of Licensees and Newsletter, require online renewals, reduce mailings and utilize posting of information on the Board's web site). By continuing to increase efficiencies and implementation of cost saving measures, the goal of the Board is to maintain the fees at the current level until 2014 or 2015.
- 4. **Continuing Competence:** The first 2-year Continuing Competence Reporting Period will end on December 31, 2010. Licensees who were licensed prior January 1, 2009 will be subject to random audits beginning in the first quarter of 2011. At its March Meeting, the Board adopted a motion that <u>all</u> Continuing Competence Reports must be entered online and the Board will no longer accept a paper version from licensees.

5. Online Renewal Process:

Statistics of licensees who renewed online: a) 2007 - 10.7%, b) 2008 - 17.5%; c) 2009 - 25%. d) 2010 - 96%. At its March meeting, the Board adopted a motion to discontinue paper renewals and require all licensees to renew online (*except for licensees who have been disciplined*). In addition, the Board will no longer mail License Renewal Cards & Wallet Cards, but will allow licensees to print their own renewal card when the renewal is completed.

6. **Directory of Licensees** (*Hard copy and CD ROM*): For licensees who requested a Directory, it should arrive in June and will include only the information approved by each licensee. At its March Meeting, the Board adopted a motion to discontinue printing the Directory of Licensees, beginning in 2011.

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- 7. **Newsletter:** At its March Meeting, the Board adopted a motion to discontinue mailing hard copies of the Newsletter after the next issue. The Newsletter will be available on the Board's webpage.
- 8. **Address Information:** Remember to keep Board apprised of current home and work addresses, phone numbers, fax numbers, and email addresses. A license renewal reminder card will be mailed the first of November.




