# **Regulatory**Spotlight

### Is Vision Therapy within the Scope of Practice?

The Board considered this question at its meeting on September 18, 2024.

In responding to physical therapy scope of practice questions, the Board applies Rule 21 NCAC 48C .0101. Permitted Practice, and other factors.

#### 21 NCAC 48C .0102 PERMITTED PRACTICE


(a) Physical therapy is presumed to include any acts, tests, procedures, modalities, treatments, or interventions that are routinely taught in educational programs or in continuing education programs for physical therapists and are routinely performed in practice settings.

After examining NC CAPTE-accredited DPT programs and sample curriculum taught jointly by a licensed OD and PT, consulting with the NC Occupational Therapy Licensure Board and a Raleigh-based Neuro-Developmental Optometrist, reviewing continuing education subject-specific course offerings, CAPTE standards and required elements, and policy and guidance documents from the American Optometric Association, the Board determined that aspects of vision therapy meet the requirements of the NC PT Practice Act and Board Rules.

Balance and gait disorders, vestibular and proprioceptive dysfunction, along with sensory and motor dysfunction are among the physical therapy issues which can arise from visual impairments and may be appropriately addressed within the context of a PT evaluation and PT plan of care. Physical therapists do not diagnose visual disorders or other medical conditions. Physical therapy licensees are often part of a team of healthcare professionals delivering vision therapy services. According to Board Rule 21 NCAC 48C .0103 (a) Prohibited **Practice**, the physical therapist is responsible for the referral of any aspect of vision therapy beyond the scope of physical therapy.

PTAs and PT/PTA students always work under the supervision of a PT. The supervising PT is responsible for determining the competence of a PTA to perform any delegated activity, including

but not limited to student supervision. Delegated activities must be deemed safe and effective for the patient and within the PT patient care plan. The PTA is responsible for performing only those delegated activities within their personal scope of practice, and for which the individual PTA has the education and training to perform, ensuring compliance with Board Rules 21 NCAC 48C Sections .0100 -Physical Therapists and .0200 -Physical Therapist Assistants.

#### **Annual License Renewal for 2025 Opens November 1, 2024**

All new PTs and PTAs licensed in the current license year (from Feb. 1, 2024 - Jan. 31, 2025) must renew by January 31, 2025, 5 pm EST.

For the first renewal, there is NO continuing competence reporting required. After the first renewal, periodic reporting of continuing competence activities is required.

In preparation for annual license renewal, licensees should log into their personal dashboard and **update their contact information** (email, home address, and work address). NC PT Board Rule 21 NCAC 48F .0105 requires licensees notify the Board within 30 days of changes.
